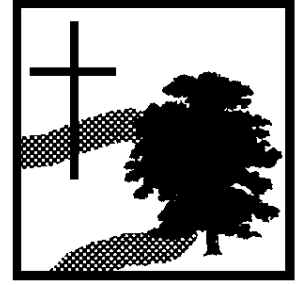

Out of the ashes, the Phoenix arises....

I was reminded of this image recently after seeing yet more images of devastation and destruction from conflict and war. 'Can there ever be peace and restoration after all this?' we ask.

It's interesting how memories come flooding back and remind us of past events. When I was at school a local church was rebuilt after a fire. Our school took part in the celebration event for its reopening. Out of the ashes, here was a new building and a new start. The phoenix arising formed the central theme of artwork and creativity for the re-opening. Pupils made a large colourful collage showing a phoenix arising from the dark ashes. Our year group performed a 'dance drama' signifying Persephone returning from the Underworld and we all took part in music for the occasion. The full significance and magnitude of all this was probably lost on some of us, yet it remains a strong illustration in my mind of hope out of darkness.

We can just imagine how majestic the sight of such a huge bird would be, rising from ashes and utter darkness and destruction. How amazing that from emptiness something strong and truly wonderful can arise.

How awesome and humbling to be reminded that strength can emerge from the bleakness of devastation.

As I thought about this, I was reminded of a film I saw years ago, of plant-life returning deep in the Canadian forest completely destroyed by wildfires. In the burned-out embers where it seemed impossible for growth to return, green shoots had emerged. Even after total destruction, it seems some things defy all the odds to rise again.

When all seems to be falling apart, it is hard to think forward to a time when things will move on in areas of conflict, and when peace, healing and hope will return. Yet life will eventually move on. There will be another day when things will change, and new growth can begin. For others far away or maybe in our own lives, new life can arise once again. Hope in emptiness, really is there. Hope that rises to replace the darkness.

We may realise we've heard this story before. At Easter something mighty happened that changed the world and continues to take us forward. In the emptiness of death and the darkness of the tomb, something 'of God' took place: unnatural, amazing, and true. In mighty power God brought new life where all seemed hopeless and dead. In resurrection, new life begins.

When Jesus arose from the tomb, evil and sin were conquered. Death is not the end, and it means life with God through Jesus is there for all. Jesus who says: *"Come to me all who are weary and I will give you rest!"* Matt 11:28.

The hope revealed in the story of Easter is hope for us all, wherever we are or however we are affected by the dreadful images of war. We know the days ahead will be very tough, yet in spite of the violence, terrible bombardment and horrors of current conflicts, a new peace can emerge in troubled lands, an opportunity to rebuild and for peaceful life to be restored. We all realise it will take a great deal of time, effort and prayer behind the scenes for things to move on, yet we know restoration is possible.

We can all play a part by continuing to pray without ceasing, not giving up and also giving thanks for the good that goes on behind the scenes in the midst of disaster (that we don't often hear about). We can all encourage the 'dance of peace' where a future will emerge from the ashes in time to come.

I hope and pray we can all draw on Easter hope in Jesus, that things can and will eventually change. For me, that childhood memory and image of hope arising from the ashes, will stay with me to remind me.

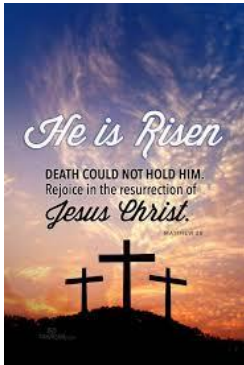

Rev Jen 10 for Easter 2024

Easter is hard to believe. Common sense tells us dead people don't rise. But why make up a story that seems incredible? which billions of people throughout the world continue to believe for 2,000 years? for which thousands of saints and martyrs have lost their lives?



1. No-one was waiting for Jesus to rise from the dead – his resurrection wasn't part of the religious or cultural background of the time – it's new!
2. People weren't stupid in the 1st Century AD – they knew the difference between dreams, visions, hallucinations and reality just as we do.
3. No-one seriously doubts that Jesus dies on the cross - Roman soldiers were professional executioners! They know their job! And a huge crowd witness his death.
4. No-one's ever disputed the grave stone was rolled away and Jesus' tomb was empty.
5. If Jesus' enemies had taken his body why didn't they produce it to quash the story?
6. If Jesus' friends had taken his body why were they willing to die for a lie?
7. Details of the Easter story differ slightly in the four gospels suggesting greater authenticity and reliability than a uniform narrative – but they agree on all the basics!
8. The first people to see the risen Jesus are women - not (seen as) credible witnesses!
9. Many people meet the risen Jesus, not just his disciples – including 500 at one time who are alive when the gospels are written.
10. The gospels record people's doubts as well as recognition of the risen Jesus – doubts aren't airbrushed out!

Carbon exists as graphite and diamond, the one soft and flaky, the other hard and crystalline. H₂O exists as water, ice and steam. Jesus' risen body is physical (he eats and can be touched) but also 'spiritual' (he appears and disappears).

'If Christ has not been raised your faith is futile' writes St Paul. No Easter, no Christianity!

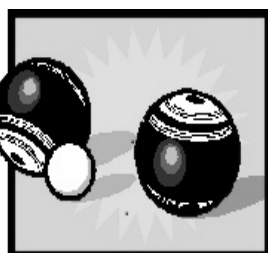

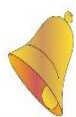
Watton at Stone Garden and Allotment Association A.G.M.

Waterford Nature Notes

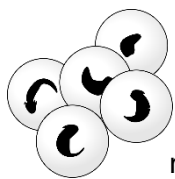
On one of those very mild, February days that we had, when the temperature was 15°, two male Brimstone butterflies were on the wing around mid-day. In a similar way to some other species, overwintering Brimstones can return to their dormant state after a day of flying.



In the morning twilight of 1st March, I heard my first Blackbird of the year. Generally, Blackbirds stop singing in early to mid-Summer and begin again in February or March. Some do start again in January, particularly city birds, but this would not usually be the full song as this is associated with territory and mating. It is only the male that sings but both sexes utter the alarm call - a constant tchuk tchuk tchuk, which can continue for several minutes as long as there is a threat, such as a cat, nearby. The female builds the nest and incubates the eggs alone but the male does help with feeding the young.

Regarding twilight, I love this time of year when the days lengthen quite quickly and all around us new life is beginning. I keep an eye on times of sunrise, sunset, twilight, dawn, etc., at this time we gain between 1 and 3 minutes of daylight at each end of the day, for example in the week between 1st and 7th March the day lengthened by 23 minutes.

In March last year, I commented upon the sources of plants and trees and importing diseases and neocotinoids. In last month's Parish News, I then read the article by Mike Treffry, the new Director of Operations, Woodhall Estate, telling how they have their own nursery to avoid just that problem. Admiral Lord Collingwood, who took command at Trafalgar after Lord Nelson was killed, would have approved. Collingwood would take a pocketful of acorns with him when he walked about the countryside and scatter them in order to provide Oak trees for future generations of shipbuilders (I wonder whether his descendant, Paul, the Durham and England cricketer, scatters Cricket Bat Willow seeds to provide for the future of cricket bats). It wasn't only the strength of the timber that made Oaks good for ships but also the naturally formed 'knees' (where a branch bends sharply) that provided strong timbers for the frame of the hull because the wood did not have to be cut or shaped so the natural grain stayed intact. I was amazed to learn many years ago that developers were importing Oak trees from Europe - why on earth was that a good idea? Oak could be considered our 'National Tree', acorns germinate readily and require little or no intervention to grow to maturity. It is believed that the trade resulted in introducing the Oak Processionary Moth, which can lead to trees dying, as did the trade in imported Ashes (Ash Dieback Disease); Horse Chestnuts (Bleeding Canker); Box (Box Tree Moth) and others.



As I expected, the female frog that was on the bottom of our pond died after about ten days. A male visited briefly but didn't stay longer than 2 or 3 days. The first spawn arrived overnight on 3rd/4th March but had disappeared by the next day. As I reported last year, after similar events in the pond, there are many predators, including dragonfly nymphs, larvae of other water insects, newts, Grass Snakes, Hedgehogs, birds, especially Herons, toads and other frogs, even rats. We can rule out insect larvae because the volume was beyond what could have been consumed by even a fairly large population in one day, we can rule out newts, for a similar reason, we can rule out Hedgehogs and birds because the spawn was in a place that they couldn't have reached, that leaves us with other frogs, toads, Grass Snakes or rats. Two days after the spawn had disappeared, another clump appeared, much as I try to not interfere with Nature, I considered that the fourth year in succession of the failure of any spawn hatching (see Nature Notes May 2023) warranted action, I transferred some of the spawn to a bucket, leaving the rest for whatever needs it as food, any tadpoles that hatch will be released into the pond to take their chances.

Walking one early afternoon I heard a constant chattering of birds in the Sycamores of Waterford Plantation, at first I thought it was Starlings but I haven't seen more than occasional Starlings in this part of the village for some years, it was a flock of Redwing. The following day, in a field nearby, I counted a mixed flock of 40-50 Redwing and Fieldfare all feeding in the same direction.

As I write this, two Buzzards perform their courtship display overhead, circling, swooping, soaring; although I didn't see it on this occasion, they even turn upside down and present their talons to one another. Red Kites and other birds of prey perform in a similar manner, even giving and receiving prey in the air but I always think that Buzzards are better aerobats than Red Kites.

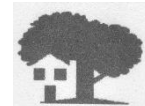
